Accelerated Reader

Accelerated Reader (AR) is a popular reading program used in our schools. AR helps teachers track students' independent practice and progress with reading. It's not specifically designed for kids who learn and think differently. But teachers can use it to help guide struggling readers to books they can read successfully. The program doesn't teach reading skills and strategies. It's intended to encourage kids to read independently, at their own level and pace.

The New Primary Maths Curriculum

The Primary Maths Curriculum has been revised by the Department of Education and is currently being rolled out in all schools across Ireland. Schools and teachers will become familiar with the new curriculum during the 2023/2024 school year and will work towards implementation of the curriculum across all classes from September 2024. The curriculum provides an inclusive and childcentred approach to learning, teaching and assessment. It provides an emphasis on creativity, playful approaches to learning, problem solving and experiences shaped by children.

Mr Mulvey and Ms Duignan attended a curriculum leaders seminar day in Navan in October and all teachers attended a teachers seminar day in Cavan Crystal Hotel on December 4th.

As a school we are beginning our implementation with a focus on "promoting maths talk" and "encouraging playfulness". This will be happening in all classes in the new year. We are looking forward to implementing the new Primary Maths Curriculum in our school.
